

JDU Privacy Statement

Jesus Disciple University takes the privacy of your personal information seriously. This statement explains what we collect, how we use it, who we share it with, and your rights regarding your information.

What we collect

When you apply to or enroll in a JDU program, we collect:

- **Identifying information:** name, email address, phone number, city, state or province, country, time zone
- **Church and ministry context:** church affiliation, formal ministry role, Jesus Disciple app usage, existing coach relationships
- **Program information:** track selection, commitments acknowledged, session attendance, assignment submissions and grades (where applicable)
- **Payment information:** processed by Stripe. JDU does not store credit card numbers.
- **Communication records:** emails, cohort discussions, notes from advising conversations
- **Session recordings:** cohort sessions are recorded via Moodle + BigBlueButton and made available within your cohort for missed-session recovery

How we use your information

We use your information to:

- Deliver the program you enrolled in — including cohort placement, coach assignment, session access, and assignment feedback
- Communicate with you about your program, session logistics, and JDU updates
- Maintain the records required to award credentials and demonstrate program integrity to future accrediting bodies
- Improve JDU programs based on aggregate cohort feedback
- Fulfill legal, accounting, and audit obligations

Who we share it with

Your information is shared only with:

- **JDU faculty and coaches** assigned to your cohort, for the purpose of delivering your program
- **JDU administrative staff** for enrollment, records, and communication
- **Anaheim Foursquare Church** (JDU's parent 501(c)(3) organization) for financial reconciliation
- **Stripe** for payment processing
- **Moodle** as JDU's learning management platform (also holds session recordings and assignment submissions)

- **Third parties only where required by law**

We do not sell, rent, or trade your personal information.

Retention

JDU retains student educational records for a minimum of **seven years** after your last program activity, in line with accreditation record-keeping norms. Financial records are retained per applicable tax and accounting requirements.

Your rights

You have the right to:

- **Access:** request a copy of the personal information JDU holds about you
- **Correction:** request correction of information that is inaccurate or incomplete
- **Deletion:** request deletion of personal information where legally permitted (some information must be retained for accreditation and legal compliance)
- **Withdrawal of consent:** withdraw consent for future promotional use of your photo or testimonial at any time

Security

JDU uses reasonable safeguards to protect your information, including encrypted transmission (TLS) and access controls limiting who can view student records. No system is perfectly secure. If we become aware of a breach affecting your information, we will notify you within 72 hours where legally required.
